Kim Katrin Milan is the co-founder and Executive Director of The People Project; an initiative to bring forth local and international community development for queer and trans folks of colour and their allies, through alternative education, art-activism and collaboration.

A public researcher, consultant and human rights educator, she has shared hundreds of unique resources and presentations around intersectional issues including race, ability & gender. A passionate speaker, Kim travels around the world talking to people about justice, equity, and human rights.

A queer womyn married to a transgender man, she has hosted events for the United Nations, acted as the Grand Marshall for Hudson, NY Pride, and hosted the opening night Black Lives Matter panel at the Art Gallery of Toronto.

From a personal perspective, as a queer womyn moving through a new part of the health system – midwifery – she will also share how positive and affirming it can be when receiving compassionate care. As well as the importance of being encouraged to have a more participatory relationship with healthcare providers who are informed and open to integrative practices.

Using an intersectional framework, Kim will describe the systemic barriers for communities of colour and LGBTQ folks. By focussing on tangible examples of cultural competency & emphasizing how important it is to reach out across difference, she will provide tangible examples; aiming to empower audience members and leave them feeling they have power to connect with diverse peoples.
